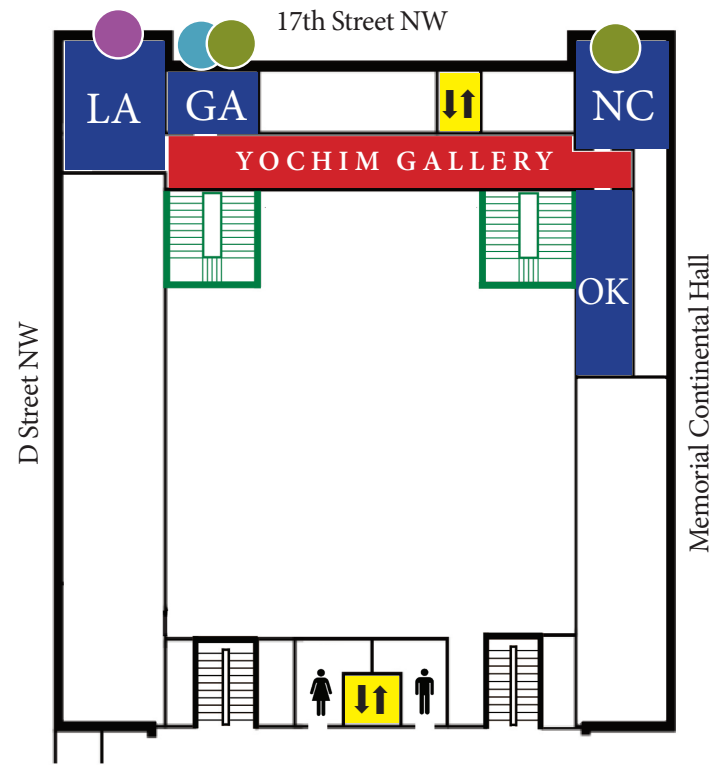

# MAP



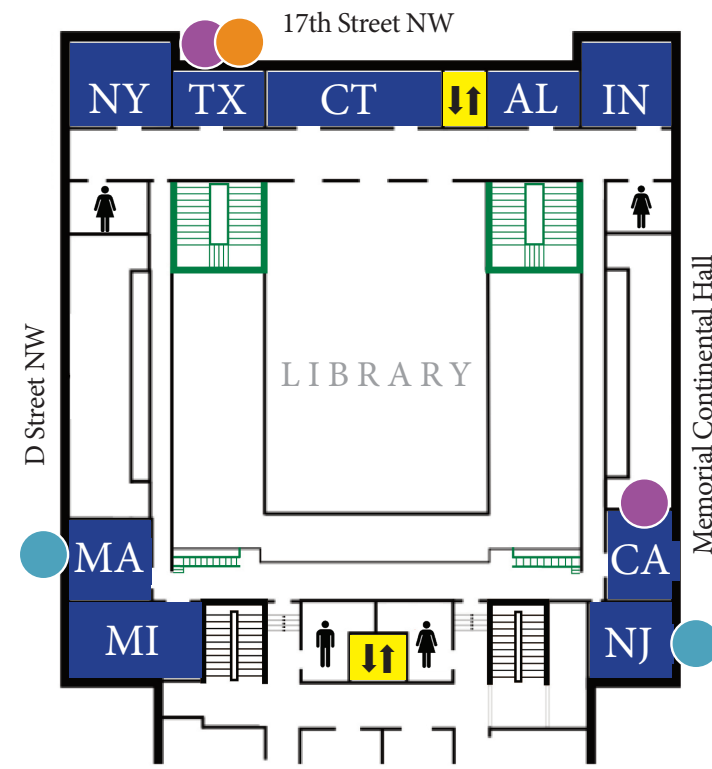
# LOWER LEVEL



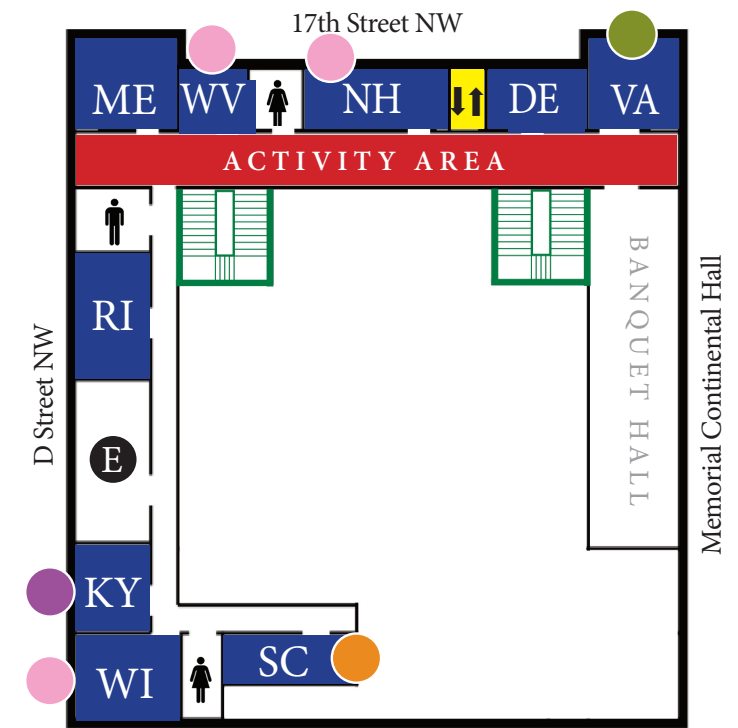
# FLOOR 1/MAIN ENTRANCE
